On behalf of Antigua and Barbuda Associations United (ABAU), I wanted to express our gratitude to you and your staff for their efforts on the school supplies and health care projects that benefited the citizens of Antigua and Barbuda.

Your support enabled us:

- To ship 123,749 school supply items to thirty (30) primary schools in Antigua and Barbuda that were distributed to over 5,000 students.

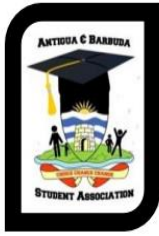
#### **Environmental Committee**

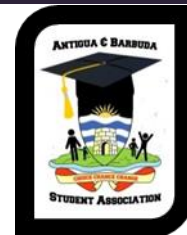
## **Mission Statement**



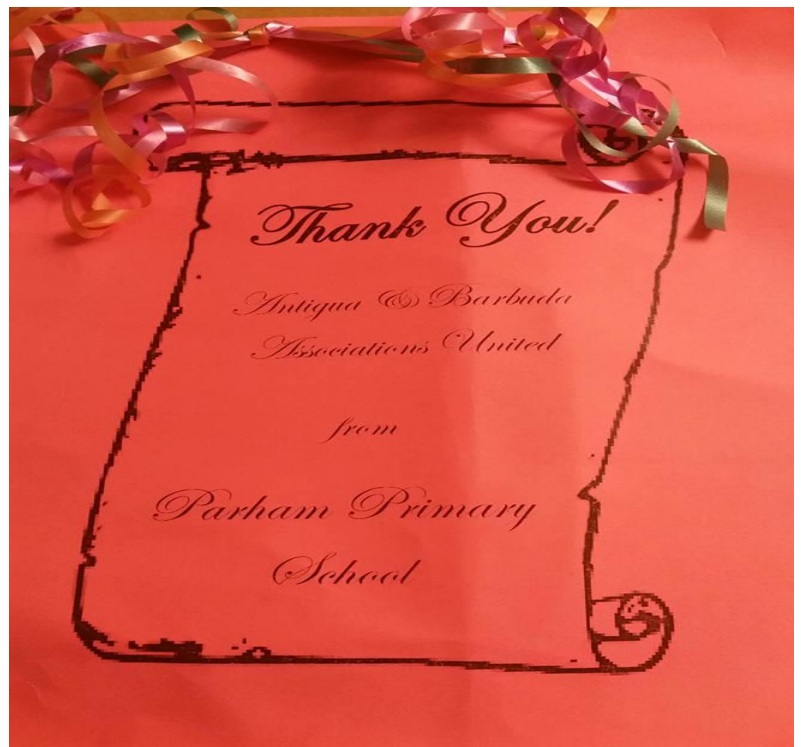

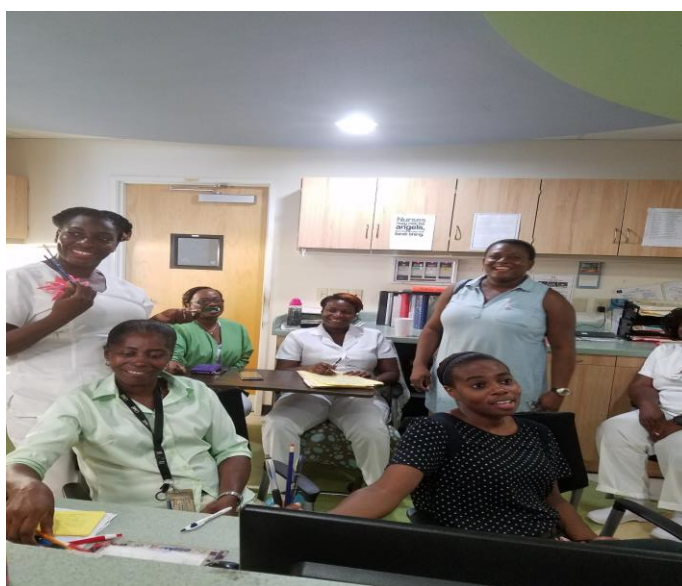
