



To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing this letter to describe the mission and services to be delivered by the Family Christian Center Medical Mission Team (FCC MMT) during our anticipated travel to Antigua & Barbuda in October of 2018.

The FCC MMT is a team of healthcare professionals, many of whom are members of the church, with a heart for delivering medical care to communities in need. This team is comprised of physicians, nurses, social workers, pastors and other volunteers. We have traveled to Nigeria, Jamaica and Trinidad making critical introductions and connections with local pastors and healthcare workers, providing education to local healthcare providers, and delivering medical care to communities in need.

Our planned dates of travel are **October 14th through 21st**. In our previous trips to Jamaica and Trinidad, we provided primary medical care (general health screening, physical examination, health education, diabetes screening) and we would like to do the same in Antigua. There is considerable expertise among the team members and we would again seek to provide targeted education and basic primary care to patients and communities in need.

Health Fete 2018

Overview

Good health, wellness, fitness and healthy lifestyles are important for all Antigua and Barbuda. Healthy people have increased capacity to learn and develop the values, attitudes and skills necessary to be competent, effective and resilient in life. The focus of the Health Fete is to help people in Antigua and Barbuda improve their lifestyles.

The Health Fete will be a five-day event:

- 1) Day one will be a health mission at a Church to provide health serves to people in the community.
- 2) Day two will be a health mission at another Church to provide health serves to people in the community.
- 3) Day three will be a health mission at another Church to provide health serves to people in the community.
- 4) Day four will be a health mission at a primary school to provide health serves to the children.
- 5) Day five will be a Health Fete for the secondary school students in Antigua and Barbuda.

Objectives

After the Health Fete attendees should be able to:

- Define physical fitness, wellness, exercise, and health.
- Define each of the components of physical fitness.
- Define each of the dimensions of wellness.
- Distinguish between a long life and a long healthy life.
- Distinguish between infectious and chronic diseases and their current impact on society.
- Distinguish between disease treatment, disease prevention, and health promotion.
- Explain the importance of healthy lifestyles to good health and wellness.
- Explain the importance of regular exercise to good fitness.

Health Fete Place

Once this project is approved we finalize the location for the churches and primary school.

The Health Fete for the secondary school students will be held at the Sir Vivian Richards Stadium – Located in Antigua and Barbuda.

Focus Areas

• Nutrition and Physical Activity:

Nutrition and physical activity are an important part of a healthy childhood. For optimal health, children need a variety of safe and nutritious foods, accompanied by daily physical activity. Balanced nutrition and physical activity have positive effects not only on physical health, but also on children's growth, mood, quality and quantity of sleep, and ability to learn.

Children develop preferences and habits regarding food and activity at an early age. These early habits are likely to continue throughout their lives. These tents will influence children's food preferences and experiences in ways that will promote health by offering foods that are safe, nutritious and appealing.

• Height, Weight and BMI:

Determining how much you should weigh is not a simple matter of looking at a height-weight chart, but includes considering the amount of bone, muscle and fat in your body's composition. The amount of fat is the critical measurement. A good indicator of how much fat you carry is the body mass index (BMI). Although it is not a perfect measure, it gives a fairly accurate assessment of how much of your body is composed of fat.

• Stress Reduction Activities:

Students who develop stress reduction skills learn how to feel and cope better without hurting themselves or others. Identifying and acknowledging the causes of stress and expressing feelings about them are usually the most effective tools students have to reduce stress, in addition to learning practical stress reduction skills.

Students' stress is usually related to everyday experiences, worries and challenges at school, home, in the community and within their peer group. For example, young people may experience stress resulting from bullying, name calling, social isolation, not getting what they want, body image, academic difficulties, and unsafe neighborhoods.

While each student will respond to and resolve stress differently, the impact of ongoing and/or unresolved stress can lead to feelings of anxiety, depression, irritability, poor concentration, aggression,

physical illness, fatigue, sleep disturbance and poor coping skills such as tobacco, drug and/or alcohol use.

• High blood pressure:

Regular high blood pressure screenings can help prevent this common condition from worsening. High blood pressure, also known as hypertension, is a serious condition that can lead to coronary heart disease (also called coronary artery disease), heart failure, stroke, kidney failure, and other health problems. A high blood pressure screening can detect the onset of this condition. "Blood pressure" is the force of blood pushing against the walls of the arteries as the heart pumps blood. If this pressure rises and stays high over time, it can damage the body in many ways. About 1 in 3 adults in the United States have high blood pressure. The condition itself usually has no symptoms. You can have it for years without knowing it. During this time, though, high blood pressure can damage the heart, blood vessels, kidneys, and other parts of your body.

Knowing your blood pressure numbers is important, even when you're feeling fine. If your blood pressure is normal, you can work with your health care team to keep it that way. If your blood pressure is too high, treatment may help prevent damage to your body's organs.

• Doctor's assessment and plan for follow up care with local Doctors:

Regular checkups will provide doctors with a way to spot any health issues early on. Checkups incorporate several tests, including preventative screenings and physical examinations, to check patients' current health and risks. If any problems are found, your doctor will provide information on treatment plans and ways that you can prevent health issues in the future.

Popular health checks include:

- Cervical smear tests (Pap tests) for women
- Blood pressure tests
- Cholesterol level checks
- Body mass index (BMI) and obesity tests
- Diabetes checks

If you have any more specific health concerns, then your doctor will be able to advise you on these and conduct the proper checks.

While doctors' checks will help pot any issues early on, you can follow a few steps to support a healthy lifestyle and to complete a number of health checks at home. It has been said that women should regularly check their breasts for lumps, while both men and women should study the skin for changes in moles or freckles. In addition, you should have a nutritious and balanced diet, exercise regularly, and maintain a healthy weight range. If you notice anything unusual, schedule a doctor's appointment as soon as possible.

Dental care

As well as appointments with a doctor, you should also schedule checkups at the dentist. It can be a tricky task knowing how often you should visit the dentist. According to The Journal of Dental
Research, the amount of times you visit the dentist depends on your level of risk for periodontal disease. While many say that visits should be made every six months, those with dental problems may need to have their teeth checked more regularly.

Good oral health plays an important role in the overall health of your body. After all, inflammatory gum disease can lead to tooth loss, while bacteria buildup in the mouth has been said to put you at <u>increased risk of heart disease</u>, according to WebMD. In addition to having regular appointments with the dentist, you should maintain a good oral care regime that includes frequent brushing and flossing.

Eye care

While doctors are able to provide some information about <u>eye issues</u>, it is important for people of all ages to schedule vision and eye care tests. Optometrists and eye doctors can check for glaucoma and provide vision reports and possible glasses or contact lens prescriptions, should you need them. People between 50 and 65 should have eye checks at least every two years, while those over the age of 65 should have a test every year. People with increased risk of having eye issues should talk to their eye doctor to see how often they should visit.

You can lower your chances of developing health issues in the future by maintaining a healthy diet; exercising regularly; having a good oral health routine; and booking regular medical, dental and eye checkups.

Health Fete Volunteers

The collaborative partners will work together to recruit volunteers for the Health Fete. The volunteers will come from Antigua and Barbuda and the United States.

Accommodation for United States Volunteers

The collaborative partners will work together to get affordable package for volunteers at the Jolly Beach Resort & Spa All Inclusive (Onsite food and beverages are included in the room price), Bolans Village, Antigua.

We will need transportation for twenty five volunteers.

Program Evaluation

ABAU will give each participant at the Conference a questionnaire to fill out. The participants will list some workshops that they would like us to offer at the next Health Fete.

Family Christian Center Medical Mission Team

Church Set Up

Greetings/ Orientation

- * It would be our goal to begin seeing patients no later than 9:00 am each day. We will arrive at each site at 8:30 am.
- * We ask that each Pastor, or his/her designee, meet us, assemble the host team and lead us in introductions including selecting key individuals that will remain available to us throughout the day
- * Host/guest pastors/chaplains will lead us in prayer/brief devotional
- * Set up begins thereafter

Set Up

At each of these churches or school we set up a clinic that included:

- * a registration station (staffed by FCC team members and local volunteer's/church members)
- * a nursing station (where vital signs and blood sugars will be measured)
- * Four (or 5) examination stations (where patients would have physical exams performed in enclosed space outfitted with desk, chair and an examination table if available)
- o In instances where separate examination stations could not be made available for each physician, we shared 2-3 private examination stations set up near the physician stations
- * A pharmacy station where medications were dispensed (2 table; one outer, one inner)
- * An education station where nutritional counseling as well as other education can be provided.
- * An eyeglass station where reading glasses can be distributed

Capacity

- * Based on the size of our team (5 providers; 5 nurses) we believe that we can see ~150 persons per day including any church volunteers and children that want to be seen. While it is not our intent to by stingy with our services, having been overwhelmed in the past, we have found it necessary to be careful with the number of patients registered.
- * Members of our team will, along with members of your congregation, will number the registrants and church volunteers that will be seen.

- * If we are to see more than 150 patients, it will be necessary for you to recruit local physicians to work with us.

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



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
